

Evacuation Plan

This document provides Evacuation Plan policies and procedures for alerting, controlling access of and moving or dispersing persons from threatened or hazardous areas to areas of safe refuge during emergencies. It also describes the organization and responsibilities necessary to conduct Evacuation Plan Operations.

Threatened or hazardous areas may be created during, but not limited to, major fires, hazardous materials incidents, transportation incidents, and earthquakes.

Definitions

Evacuation – Removing persons and/or animals from an area that is safe at the present time but may become hazardous and/or contaminated in the near future.

There are three stages of evacuation:

1. Evacuation Alert – Evacuation Alert allows for the population at risk to begin and orderly preparation to voluntarily leave the affected area within a specified time frame. However, the reality of the situation may require immediate action with very short notice.

Note: In some instances and Evacuation Order is immediate and no Evacuation Alert is given

2. Evacuation Order – The population at risk is ordered to evacuate the area specified in a formal written order. This is an order and as such does not allow for any discretionary decision on the part of the population at risk. They must leave the area immediately.

3. All Clear – The population at risk is allowed to return to the area previously evacuated, having been advised that the danger has passed. There is the possibility that the danger may re-manifest itself and the Evacuation Notification reinstated.

Shelter-in-place – Advise to residents to remain inside and seal the building (shutting down heating and air conditioning units). This gives immediate protection and should be considered for short duration.

Rescue – Locating, stabilizing and removing victims from hazardous and/or contaminated area. Only Emergency Services Personnel with appropriate protective equipment and training should conduct rescue operations.

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Authority

It is not common practice to force an occupant from their private property when, after being notified of the risk, they wish to remain. While additional verbal persuasion should be employed when a life-endangering situation is imminent, time may only allow for obtaining the name and address of the person and next-of-kin.

Various other methods may be available to local law enforcement agencies to remove people, if that person's presence endangers an operation or, if that person is endangering the lives of children.

Objectives

The objectives of the Evacuation Plan are to:

- Decide whether the exposed population is more effectively protected by sheltering-in-place or evacuation
- Develop a Plan based on the type of threat, population, time, weather, communications, response resources and capabilities
- Develop notification and instructional information for persons within the threatened area
- Expedite the evacuation of persons from hazardous areas, control evacuation traffic and provide adequate means to transport persons without vehicles
- Institute access control measures to prevent unauthorized persons from entering vacated or partially vacated areas
- Provide sufficient resources to implement the Plan
- Monitor the Plan and make changes as conditions warrant

Elements

The elements of the Plan include, but are not limited to, the following nine items:

1. Coordination with all potentially involved agencies and resources regarding their roles, responsibilities and tasks to be accomplished
2. Identification and clear delineation of the structures, facilities, or neighbourhoods subject to the selected protective action
3. Establishment of easily understood directions and clearly identified evacuation routes

Elements (continued)

4. Establish staff requirements, equipment and announce shelter locations
5. Obtain alternate modes of transportation to aid those with special requirements or limited mobility
6. Plan and coordinate with school officials to effectively evacuate or implement in-place protection at the elementary schools
7. Establish readily identifiable perimeters and provide security within evacuated areas
8. Plan for demobilization, lifting evacuation orders, and deactivating shelters and reception centres
9. Develop clear, complete and concise evacuation/shelter-in-place announcements, messages and notices

Responsibilities

The RCMP has overall responsibility for Evacuation Operations.

In most situations, the Incident Commander (IC) may recommend an evacuation. If the Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) has been activated, the decision to evacuate will be made in consultation with the Director of the Emergency Operations Centre.

The responsibility for opening a Reception Centre and/or group lodging belongs to the Emergency Social Services (ESS) Director as a member of the Operations Branch of the EOC.

Notification

The coordinator of the Emergency Program shall be notified whenever a significant Evacuation Action is implemented or anticipated.

The ESS Director shall be notified whenever an Evacuation Action is implemented or anticipated. The Director will open a designated Reception Centre.

If the Evacuation Plan is initiated, the Emergency Operations Centre shall ensure that the senior government officials and PEP have been notified.

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Alerting the Public

The method of alerting the public will be dependent upon time available, hazard area, and resources available. Available options include:

- Distribution of evacuation notices
- Law enforcement and fire vehicles using public address systems
- Initiating the Neighbourhood Telephone Trees
- Local cable TV, radio, and other news media

The Evacuation Plan information provided to the public will include the following:

- Whether local residents should evacuate or shelter-in-place
- Why they are being advised/ordered to evacuate or shelter-in-place
- Whether evacuation is an alert or an order
- The evacuation routes, including conditions of roads
- The location of reception centre(s)
- Assembly points for those needing transportation
- Estimated duration of evacuation

Concept of Operations

Evacuation Plans are associated with the phases listed in this section. However, not all disasters will include each phase

- **Preparedness:**
Evacuation Plan includes information regarding special facilities, traffic control points, and evacuation routes. Exercises should be conducted to test the plan and train personnel
- **Increase Readiness:**
Orientation meetings will be held to brief potential responding departments, agencies, and relevant community groups about the situation and plan to be implemented
- **Implementation:**
It is the responsibility of the Evacuation Team at the time of the incident to develop a specific plan, which incorporates the objectives and elements as stated in this document.
Areas to be evacuated, or where sheltering-in-place will occur, will be determined based on identified target hazard areas, or by estimates made at the time. The area may change based upon changes in conditions or projections. Projections may require that evacuation or sheltering-in-place occur in larger areas than initially impacted.

Implementation (continued)

- After evacuation is publicly announced, traffic control will be initiated, reception centres will be activated, and actions will be taken to control unauthorized access into evacuated areas
- Personnel need to be assigned to Reception Centres to keep evacuees informed about the situation and estimated duration until allowing return to property and residence

Sustained Response:

Activities at this time may include assisting with lifesaving and property-protecting measures and providing security for and access to evacuated areas

Recovery:

Continue the focus on providing essential services during recovery operations. Traffic and access control will continue as required, to allow persons to return to their property or residence in an orderly fashion

Evacuation Routes and Access Control Points

The RCMP, with input from the IC, will select the best routes for evacuation from the threatened area. The best routes may have to be selected at the time of the incident. Notification of changes in the selected routes will be made to the EOC, ESS Director as well as field personnel.

Evacuation Route/Transportation Procedures

- Most evacuees use their own personal transportation during evacuations.
- Encourage evacuees to limit the number of vehicles to one per family
- Encourage evacuees to help transport neighbours
- In some cases, it may be necessary to control traffic on other routes to minimize the impact on evacuation traffic
- Multiple passenger vehicles, which may be utilized, include school buses or public transit and private buses

Access Control

- As an area is being evacuated, access controls must be established. Security may be obtained by establishing staffed Access Control Points and barricades at key locations around the perimeter.

Access Control (continued)

The objectives of Access Control are to:

- Provide a controlled area from which an emergency evacuation will take place and prevent entry by unauthorized persons
- Protect lives by controlling entry into the hazard area
- Maintain law and order in the hazard area

Criteria for allowing entry into closed areas will be established for each incident.

- **No access** – Prohibits the public from entering the closed area(s). Authorized personnel as required
- **Limited Access** – Allows persons into closed area(s) according to access criteria established by the IC

People Needing Special Assistance

If an evacuation is expected, the Emergency Program will contact? to determine which people may require special assistance. The district contacts will also be asked to help locate and assist such individuals

Evacuation of Animals: domestic and livestock

Domestic: Domestic animals are the direct responsibility of the owner, who shall provide a carrying case/cage/leashes, any medications and basic food and water as required. A separate pet care shelter may be established by ESS. The pet care shelter will not be in the reception centre

Livestock: While the first responsibility must rest with the individual owner, it is recognized that the Emergency Program will be called upon to assist in livestock evacuation during a disaster

Prior to an emergency evacuation the Emergency Program shall maintain an updated record (including animal types and approx numbers) and a map indicating where livestock are located, and where and how livestock could be shipped in the event of an evacuation.

Livestock evacuation is based on the same premise as that of people. There will be, if time allows, three stages: Alert, Order, and All Clear. Livestock Alert may precede that of people due to loading and transport time involved.

Direction and coordination of any livestock evacuation will originate from the EOC. An attempt will be made to bring in someone from the Farmers Institute to help co-ordinate the evacuation. The Livestock Evacuation Checklist (see emergency plan) will be utilized during the evacuation.

Evacuation Checklist

The Evacuation Plan is basic and may vary according to the type of incident and geographic area involved. The Plan Checklist (see appendix 1) is to assist in effectively responding to an evacuation scenario. The checklist is written for a major incident. In most cases you will not need to do each item on the list; use only those needed. **Use only as a guide**

Review/Revision of the Plan

1. In January of each year, the planning team shall review the Evacuation Plan.
2. Exercises, post-evacuation critiques, and reviews generally capture the need for revisions to the plan. Revisions, with Planning Team approval, can take place at anytime during the year.
3. Revisions to any Appendices should be issued, as they become available.

Evacuation Plan Checklist, Continued

- When Emergency Operations Centre operational
 - Ensure that notification has been given to local elected officials and PEP
 - Setup reception centre, consider number of people who will need assistance
 - Consider special needs evacuees and required transportation and establish priorities
 - Consider potential for domestic animals to be evacuated with families and alert ESS to prepare for pet evacuees
 - Consider potential for farm animals to be evacuated and alert Livestock Evacuation Team
 - Establish and announce a telephone number for evacuees to call for information
 - Track the number of evacuees and any reported injuries
 - Track all costs related to the evacuation incident
 - Document the decision process

- Establish a policy on whether persons will be Alerted or Ordered to evacuate

- Prepare, print and distribute Evacuation Alert or Evacuation Orders, if time permits

- Announce Evacuation Plan decisions (boundaries, zones and routes)

- Assemble, brief, and deploy Evacuation personnel

- Consider the need for Crisis Intervention Team

- Use the Reception Centre to keep evacuees informed of incident progress and projected return times

- Decide on allowing return into evacuated zone in consultation with all relevant parties

- Prepare, print and distribute All Clear notice

- Schedule a debriefing with all parties to evaluate the Evacuation
